

As the governing body of the Division, the Board of Trustees, through the legislative framework of *The Public Schools Act*, is responsible for overseeing and managing the planning and delivery of education programs and services to the students of the Division. The Board of Trustees believes that, while carrying out these legislated responsibilities, the Board has a responsibility to be an advocate for all residents of the Division, reflecting their values and responding to their needs. The Board of Trustees will carry out these responsibilities by the development of policy, strategic planning and the establishment of an annual budget reflecting the Board's priorities.

The Board of Trustees believes that a work plan outlining the Board's roles and responsibilities will assist the Board in governing the Division appropriately. This plan, which reinforces legislative requirements and Board directions, will outline monthly and yearly duties. The major responsibilities to be covered in the Board of Trustees work plan are:

- Accountability to Provincial Government
- Accountability to the Community
- Strategic Planning
- Policy Development
- CEO/Board Relations
- Political Advocacy
- Board Development
- Fiscal Responsibility

The work plan will be reviewed and, if necessary, revised annually.
