

Frontier School Division recognizes that, in some instances, high school students may obtain credits using an alternative process to regular classroom instruction. These alternatives are challenge for credit, substitution for credit, and special language option.

1. Challenge for Credit

The challenge for credit option provides a process for high school students to demonstrate they have achieved learning outcomes as defined in the Manitoba Education curriculum for a specific course.

2. Substitution for Credit

In exceptional circumstances, and in discussion with parents, a school administrator may recommend the substitution of a maximum of two credits in any subject area. The Chief Superintendent shall approve the substitution.

3. Special Language Credit Option

High school students who demonstrate the proficiency requirements in a language other than English or French may claim credits in accordance with the following:

- One Special Language Credit may be earned at each of the senior years.
- The maximum number of Special Language Credits allowed is four.
- Special Language Credits are recognized as Manitoba Education approved credits. They are not School Initiated Courses (SICs).
