

Teacherages

There are 10 teacherages located next to the school. These one- to four-bedroom units include detached houses and duplex units. Frontier School Division subsidizes rental fees and provides maintenance.

Teacherages are equipped with appliances (washer, dryer, fridge, and stove) and pets are allowed. Wireless high speed internet is available but must be arranged and paid for by the tenant.

PROGRAM AND ACTIVITY HIGHLIGHT


In addition to a focus on literacy and numeracy at all grade levels including Adult Education, Brochet School features lots of physical education programs. Students also have opportunities to participate in a variety of clubs, such a marathon club for grades 5 to 9. The school's Earth Club teaches students at all grade levels how to effectively reduce, reuse and recycle for the betterment of our planet. A new Tower Garden Program helps empower students to addresses the issue of food sovereignty in the North by planting indoor, vertical farms from which fresh vegetables and berries can be harvested year-round.

About the Community

Brochet is located on the eastern shore of scenic Reindeer Lake and has been part of the overlapping traditional territories of the Dene and Cree peoples since time immemorial. There are no all-weather roads into the community. A winter road from Lynn Lake is open for a few months each year. However, daily Perimeter Airlines flights are available year-round.

The community's economy is based on commercial fishing, trapping and tourism. Local amenities include a Northern Store, nursing station, community hall/youth centre, baseball diamond and outdoor skating rink.

Frontier School Division spans nearly 75% of the province and is organized into 5 Areas.
