<u>Literacy:</u> All students will develop the foundational literacy skills appropriate for their age and/or grade level.	<u>Nursery / Kindergarten</u> Programs are play-based, focussing on the development of conceptual knowledge, vocabulary and language through literacy and language rich learning contexts that maximize children's listening and speaking. Professional learning for teachers re: intentional play-based programming and language development. Programs that support early childhood education are established and maintained (Dolly Parton Imagination Library, Welcome to Kindergarten, PEER Program). Partnerships with community Early Childhood Education programs are established and maintained (Head Start, Day Care Centres). 	<u>Early & Middle Years</u> The focus of Literacy programming is reading and writing. Each classroom implements an uninterrupted literacy block: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Gr 1-3 100 minutes; • Gr 4-6 90 minutes. Teachers provide small group, individualized instruction appropriate for the instructional and / or developmental needs of the student(s). Teachers implement structures and strategies based in research that provide students with numerous and varied tasks and activities to support literacy growth and achievement.	Ultimately, students in all grades will demonstrate an ability to read and write at appropriate year-end levels (as indicated by PARA mentoring tool, GR 1-3 and FSD Literacy tool, Instructional Reading level tracker, GR 1-8). Each year, the number of students achieving grade level outcomes in literacy will increase by a minimum of 5%. Each classroom (Grades 1 to 9) implements a 60 minute uninterrupted numeracy block. The Division implements the FSD 5-year numeracy plan. The Division maintains its partnership with the Manitoba Rural Learning Consortium (mRLC) in Numeracy in order to inform the Division plan and to build coaches and teachers expertise in mathematics.	Ultimately, students will demonstrate good to excellent understanding of the mathematics outcomes, as outlined in the MB Framework, appropriate for their grade / course. Each year, there will be a 5% increase in the number of students who successfully meet grade / course level requirements in mathematics. Teachers implement structures and strategies based in current research in order to support student achievement in mathematics. Teachers are engaged in professional learning and conversations in order to develop a high level of proficiency in their numeracy instruction.
